- The last rains are in spring, and are called the Malkosh. These latter rains of the rainy season ripen the crops

early rain (October–November or December–January) and latter rain (March–April, Jewish month of **Nissan**)






Daniel 9:26-27 (NIV)



1 Thessalonians 4:16–17 (NIV)

¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷ After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.



Neither resuscitation nor resurrection implies spiritual life. Many who were resuscitated had not believed and may have perished in unbelife. those who die in fiath will only experienc "the first death" (the punishment for Adam's sin-physical death). All who die in unbeleif will be resurrected to experience "the second death" (the punishment of spiritual death-the lake of fire). In immortal bodies, whey will suffer torment throughout eternity.






Distinction of Three Judgments

- Crowns (stephanos)
 - Incorruptible crown for those who master their flesh (1 Cor 9:25)
 - Crown of hope or joy (soul-winner's) who bore fruit in others' lives for Christ (1 Thess 2:19)
 - Crown of life for believers who patiently endures trials (James 1:12)
 - Crown of righteousness for those who long for Christ's return (2 Tim 4:8)
 - Crown of glory for spiritual shepherds who willingly feed the flock of God (1 Peter 5:4)
- Responsible positions in the millennial kingdom (Matt 25:21,23; 1 Cor 6:2, Rev 20:4)



Trumpet Judgments

Trumpets	Rev.	Events
First	8:6-7	Burns up one third of earth's vegetation by hail and fire
Second	8:8-9	Destroys one third of sea creatures and ships by a huge fiery object which turns one third of the seas into blood
Third	8:10-11	Kills through pollution of one third of fresh water by Wormwood, a falling star
Fourth	8:12	Partial darkness from striking out a third of the sun, moon, and stars
Fifth	9:1-12	woe#1: terrible supernatural locust-like creatures to torment only non-Christians for five months
Sixth	9:13-21	woe#2: terrible supernatural horse-and-riders creatures from the Euphrates which slays one third of earth
Seventh	11:15-19	Introduces the seven bowl judgments.



Antichrist and The False Prophet

- **Antichrist** (Rev 13:1-10)
 - represented by the beast out of the sea
 - gains a worldwide following by unbelievers through Satanic power and persecutes Christians
- The False Prophet (Rev 13:11-18)
 - represented by the beast out of the earth
 - glorifies the Antichrist
 - persecute Christians who lack the mark of the Antichrist



Bowl	Rev.	Events
First	16:1-2	Ugly, painful sores upon Antichrist's followers
Second	16:3	Kills all salt water marine life by turning seas to blood
Third	16:4-7	Kills all fresh water marine life by turning all rivers and streams to blood
Fourth	16:8-9	Burn unrepentant people with the sun's intense fire
Fifth	16:10-11	Earth into darkness while sores and burns continues
Sixth	16:12-16	Dries up the Euphrates so that the armies can cross to fight at Armageddon
Seventh	16:17-21	Earthquake which levels mountains and islands, and 100-pounds hailstones

Antichrist and The False Prophet Systems

- Fall of the religious world system
 - Worship of the Antichrist
 - Apostate world church
 - Symbolized by the Great Harlot, Babylon the Great
 - Symbolized by a prostitute on a beast with seven heads and ten horns
 - Adulterated doctrines
- Fall of the commercial world system
 - Corrupt practices
 - Injustice







Revelation 20:11–15 (NIV)


¹¹ Then I saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it. The earth and the heavens fled from his presence, and there was no place for them. ¹² And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books.

The Great White Throne

Revelation 20:11–15 (NIV)

¹³ The sea gave up the dead that were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead that were in them, and each person was judged according to what they had done. ¹⁴ Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death.

¹⁵ Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.



Compartmental concept is based on the OT concept of afterlife. Samuel's postmortem prophecy in 1Sa 28:13, 19, theological development of afterlife in intertestamental Jewish and Rabbinic literature, and from a literal interpretation of Jesus' account of the "Rich Man & Lazarus" in Lk 16:19-31.


