SERMON NOTE: Uncompromised Trust In GOD









When we are still worry today till our lives is paralyzed, we live in sin.

If HE is for us, why should we be worried.



In the world, it advocate for is to first get the Pussycat needs before you go for other needs, then lastly-spiritual... But in Kingdom of GOD, it is the opposite.




